The children will learn to:

Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. For example: writing a pretend shopping list that starts at the top of the page.
Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonics knowledge, including some common exception words.
Write recognisable letters; most of which are correctly formed.

The children will learn to:

Automatically recall number bonds for numbers 0–10.
Compare length, weight and capacity.

Subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5.

The children will learn to: • Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants. • Describe their immediate environment using knowledge from observation, discussion, stories, non-fiction texts and maps.

Opportunities to support and extend learning outside school

•Offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems when appropriate.

The children will learn to:

Negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for themselves and others.
Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing – using the tripod grip in almost all cases.
Demonstrate strength, balance and coordination when playing.
Move energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing.
