






Our text this week is a novel written by SF Said called "Varjak Paw". This text was written in 2003!

# **Main Task:**

- 3) The use of the word swallow suggests that the window was so large in comparison to Varjak that it looked like he had been eaten by it.
- 4) The invisibility cloak of darkness refers to it being so dark that it would be hard to see Varjak on his travels, providing him with a cloak of invisibility!
- 5) Jalal may be someone who Varjak looks up to and has learnt from, particularly the skill of shadow walking.




