RECAP

Autumn 1 - Lines of Significance (Geography)

The equator - invisible line in the middle of the earth. Countries on it are hot and rainy, because more sun falls on it.

Latitude: distance from the equator. Lines of latitude: Equator, Tropic of Cancer, Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle, Antarctic Circle (horizontal).

Lines of longitude: another measure of where you are on the earth (vertical).

Time zones: Greenwich Mean Time is the time zone in the UK, which is the starting point for all the other time zones.

For example, France is 1 hour ahead, Washington DC is 5 hours behind. Can use atlas to work out.

RECAP

Autumn 2 - Anglo-Saxons (History)

The Anglo-Saxons came to Britain after the Romans left. There were push and pull factors for why they came.

E.g. flooding (push factor), to make new homes (pull factor).

Pagan religion - multiple gods and goddesses.

Eventually converted to Christianity by religious figures.

Village life: most people were farmers and worked on the land. Trading objects, working together to provide.

We looked at Anglo-Saxon artefacts, like runes, stone statues and clay pots.

RECAP

Spring 1 - Vikings (History)

Vikings came to Britain to invade. First came in 793 AD. Took over different parts of the country.

Came for many reasons, e.g. money (they tried to steal from the monasteries), farming land (they wanted good crops) and for revenge (members of their families had been killed in battle).

Eventually they left (1066 AD).

Vikings also followed the Pagan religion with multiple gods.



The weather each continent experiences will be different, depending on where it is in the world.

An invisible line called the **Equator** runs around the **Earth**.

The countries that have the warmest weather are on or close to the **Equator**.



The **Equator** marks the area of the world that receives the greatest amount of energy from the sun.

Can you name a **continent** that is on or near the **Equator?**




Europe's climate

Think about where the Equator would be positioned on the map.

What might the weather and climate be like in Europe?

Europe is north of the **Equator**. The southern parts enjoy a **Mediterranean climate** (hot summers), while central Europe has a more **temperate climate** (with no extreme weather). The north of Europe has a **polar climate** (very dry, with low temperatures).

European countries

Ireland: Is the third-largest island in Europe and is made up of two countries: Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

United Kingdom: Is made up of four individual countries. The Queen is the head of state.


Spain: Has many vibrant cities. Spain's coast is very popular with tourists, due to its warm weather.
